Genesis 12:15

15 And when Pharaoh's officials saw her, they praised her to Pharaoh, and she was taken into his palace.

Genesis 12:16

¹⁶He treated Abram well for her sake, and Abram acquired sheep and cattle, male and female donkeys, menservants and maidservants, and camels.

Genesis 12:17

17 But the Lord inflicted serious diseases on Pharaoh and his household because of Abram's wife Sarai.

Genesis 12:18

18 So Pharaoh summoned Abram. “What have you done to me?” he said. “Why didn’t you tell me she was your wife?”

Genesis 12:19

19Why did you say, ‘She is my sister,’ so that I took her to be my wife? Now then, here is your wife. Take her and go!”

Genesis 12:20

20Then Pharaoh gave orders about Abram to his men, and they sent him on his way, with his wife and everything he had.
